



Child Find

Child Find refers to activities undertaken by CCA to identify, locate and evaluate children who are suspected of having disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, and determine their need for special education and related services. The purpose is to locate these children so that a free appropriate public education (FAPE) can be made available.

The types of disabilities that, if found, may cause a child to need services are: autism, deaf-blindness, deafness, emotional disturbance, hearing impairment, intellectual disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment due to chronic or acute health problems, specific learning disabilities, speech language impairment, traumatic brain injury and visual impairment including blindness.
